

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

AlMAN College of Arts and Science for Women was established by the AlMAN Education and Welfare Society as a religious minority institution with a primary objective of providing higher education to the socially backward section of the society in general and Muslim minority women in particular. The college was inaugurated in the year 2000 in Tiruchirappalli, Tamil Nadu, with 50 students registered in 3 undergraduate courses.

The College is located at K. Sathanur, off K.K Nagar, Tiruchirappalli Town, just 5 km away from the Tiruchirappalli Railway Junction, Central Bus Stand and Airport. The College has now grown in length & breadth. The College now offers 11 Undergraduate and 4 Postgraduate courses, viz., B.A. English, BBA, B.Com, B.Sc. Computer Science, B.C.A, B.Sc. Nutrition& Dietetics, B.Sc. Mathematics, B.Sc. Physics, B.Sc. Apparel and Fashion Technology, B.Com. Computer Application, B.Sc. Psychology, M.A English, M.Sc. Computer Science, M.Com & M.Sc. Food Service Management & Dietetics. The present college strength is 1037. There are 65 Teaching and 20 non-teaching staff members.

The serene campus of AIMAN College consists of an administrative Block, three two-storeyed academic blocks, one resplendent auditorium, fantabulous seminar hall replete with LCD projectors and audio-video systems, futuristic Computer lab, ultramodern fashion technology laboratory, advanced Digital Language Lab, well stacked automated library, well equipped Physics, Psychology, Chemistry lab and a fully furnished luxurious Nutrition and Dietetics lab. A gratifying cafeteria runs inside the campus which serves hot and cold, rich and healthy food at an affordable price for all those who visit the campus. The canteen is maintained neat, clean

and hygienic ensuring the health of the consumers. The entire campus is monitored under CCTV surveillance to ensure a safe and secure learning environment for the students.

AlMAN is a campus which attracts students from several parts of the state. To affirm the safety and security of the residential students, the campus is inbuilt with a comfortable hostel facility.

The hostel consists of rooms with A/C and rooms without A/C, a large kitchen and a dining hall, clean and maintained well. An exclusive NRI block is also available with air conditioned rooms.

The day scholars commute by 13 college buses from the city and places 25kms away from the college as well. A free shuttle bus service is also available from Central Bus Stand to College. Discipline and character building are given prime importance in the college. Moral and Deeniyath classes are held regularly. A modest Masjid adds to the spiritual component of the campus.

The college has been registering excellent results consistently in the University Examinations ever since its inception. The college produces many rank holders every year. Most of the alumnae are well placed and well settled in our country and abroad. A Special feature of the college is the MUBALLIGA Course - A Three Year Diploma Course offered under the auspices of the United Welfare Organization (UNWO/UNIS), Chennai. As a part of Skill development, the students are given training in Tailoring, Spoken English, Hindi and Arabic Skills by experts in these fields. Add on courses are offered to the students by various departments to enrich their skills and increase employability. Short term /Certificate course / Diploma courses are conducted in the college by the Institute of Entrepreneurship and Carrier Development (IECD), Bharathidasan University, Trichy.

Special care is taken for physical fitness by providing sports and games facilities to the students. As outreach programs, the students take part enthusiastically in extra- curricular activities like NSS (National Service Scheme), YRC (Youth Red Cross), RRC (Red Ribbon Club), Youth Exnora and CCC (Citizen Consumer Club), YOGA Club & ECO Club. In addition, LEO club also functions in the college to inculcate civic and social consciousness among students. They are also encouraged to participate in competitions and cultural events organized by other institutions. ELC (Electoral Literacy Club) engages students through interesting activities and hands-on experience to sensitise them on their electoral rights and familiarise them with the electoral process of registration and voting. Book Club provides an opportunity for the students to share information and the pleasure of reading. It helps the students to become enthusiastic and enthralled with wonderful world of literature. GCC (Gender Champions Club) are envisaged as responsible leaders who will facilitate an enabling environment within the institution where girls are treated with dignity, respect and strengthen the potential of these young people to advocate for gender equality and monitor progress towards gender justice.

The College has signed an MOU with ICT Academy to enhance the skills of the students and provide the industry-institute interface and to enlighten the faculty through Faculty Development Programs, Institution Innovation Council (IIC) an Initiative of MHRD for selected Higher Education Institutes. Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Govt. of India has established 'MHRD's Innovation Cell (MIC)' to systematically foster the culture of Innovation amongst all Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). AIMAN College of Arts and Science for Women is a member IIC. The Ministry of Education (MoE) (formerly Ministry Human Resource

Development (MHRD)} launched Unnat Bharat Abhiyan which is to enable Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) to work with the rural people and identify the challenges they face and come up with solutions for their sustainable development. "Rural Entrepreneurship Development (RED) Cell Registered with MGNCRE" with a Mission to inculcate Entrepreneurship among students in Rural India, AIMAN College Of Arts And Science for Women has constituted Rural Entrepreneurship Development (RED) Cell under Mahatma Gandhi National Council for Rural Education (MGNCRE), Ministry of Education, Government of India. The Institution has successfully framed the SES REC Action Plan and constituted ten working groups for improving facilities in the campus and the Community/Adopted Villages in the areas of Sanitation & Hygiene, Waste Management, Water Management, Energy Conservation and Greenery post COV1D-19, along with the observation of three Environment. Entrepreneurship and Community Engagement related days to inculcate in faculty, students and community, the practices of Mentoring, Social Responsibility, Swachhta and Care for Environment and Resources.

The college aims at promoting academic excellence, develops discipline and self-reliance in students and makes them socially responsible citizens. The College strives to motivate its students to excel in every aspect of life and to have integrated dynamic personality. Students, being intellectually competent, morally upright, spiritually strong, purposefully oriented and sensitive to the needs of the society will be able to face life's challenges courageously and work committedly for the welfare of all people without discrimination.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- All admissions to the college are made as per the instructions given by the University or the authorities.
- The college follows Day Order System. Days are denoted by I, II, IV, V & VI and the time table will be followed, accordingly in a continuous manner.
- If the college closes on any working day due to some unforeseen reasons, the day order will be followed on the Saturday to compensate the working day lost.
- If a student leaves the college in the middle of any semester she cannot claim remission of any portion of the fees.
- If a student who has duly paid the fees and dues to laboratories and library, leaves the college, she will be issued a transfer certificate and a conduct certificate through a process of application to the Principal.
- If a student leaves the college at the end of an academic year she can receive the attendance certificate required by the University if she applies for.
- Deeniyath classes for Muslim students and moral classes for non-Muslim students will be conducted.
- 100% attendance and best library user will be rewarded on Annual Day.
- Attendance is compulsory for all functions and departmental activities.
- ❖ All students should involve themselves in Part V activities such as NSS, LEO, EXNORA, YRC, RRC.

PAYMENT OF FEES

The fees for each semester and the university examinations should be paid on or before the last date notified on the notice board. The names of those who do not pay the semester fees on or before the last date will be removed

- from the rolls without any prior intimation. The Principal may consider re-admission of such students at her discretion.
- The second and third year students shall pay the fees within 30 days of the reopening of the College. If the fees are not paid within a month, the student's name will be removed from the rolls.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE

- Absence for one period in a session will count as absence for half a day. Leave of absence from class test will be granted only when they are sanctioned by the Head of the Department concerned.
- A medical Fitness Certificate should be submitted on the day of attending the class after the absence due to diseases.
- A Certificate of attendance required for admission to the University examination will not in any case be granted, unless the student earns not less than 75% of attendance in a semester.
- A student should have obtained "NO DUES CERTIFICATE" from the office, library, laboratory, hostel before hall ticket is issued. Laboratory breakage shall be cleared every year before collecting hall ticket.
- The college reserves the right to strike off the roll if any student who is absent for a prolonged period without producing satisfactory reasons, though she may have the necessary minimum of attendance to earn the attendance certificate.

UNIVERSITY REGULATIONS REQUIREMENTS TO APPEAR FOR THE EXAMINATIONS

1. Passing Minimum

A candidate shall be declared to have passed in a theory paper or practical if she obtains not less than 40% of marks for UG and 50% of marks for PG respectively. A candidate failing to



secure the minimum marks prescribed shall be required to reappear for the examination in that paper/ practical.

2. Classification of Successful Candidates

U.G & P.G Candidates who pass all the part III examination in the First attempt within a period of three years/ two years respectively securing

Average mark >=75% is First class with Distinction

Average mark >=60% and <= 74% is First Class

Average mark >=50% and <=59% is Second Class

Average mark >=40% and <=49% is Third Class

3. Conferment of the Degree

No candidate shall be eligible for conferment of the UG/PG degree unless she has undergone the prescribed course of study for a period of not less than six semesters / four semesters respectively in an Institution approved by or affiliated to the University.

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GENERAL RULES ON BEHAVIOUR

- ★ Students should come to the college neatly and decently dressed.
- ★ Gathering in groups at entrance, exit, pathways, staircases, gardens and gateway is strictly prohibited.
- ★ On entering the class, students will observe strict silence irrespective of the presence or absence of the teacher.
- ★ Students will not be permitted to leave the class or laboratory without the permission of the teacher.
- ★ Students are expected to read the notice put up on the college notice board.
- ★ Ignorance of any notice thus displayed will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with direction contained in it.
- ★ No Society, Association or Club shall be formed without the prior written permission of the Principal.
- ★ No student shall cause or put up any notice without the approval of the Principal.
- ★ Student shall not take law into their hands with the employees of the College. All complaints about them shall be made to the Principal and HODs.
- ★ No Student of one class shall enter any other class under any pretext.
- ★ No outsider can visit a student without the permission of the HOD or Principal.
- ★ In general, students are expected to bring good name and reputation to the College with their good behaviour. Any student acting contrary to these rules will be dealt with seriously.



★ If any student is found to misbehave or violate the rules Parents shall be intimated with a memo for the first time. Secondly, a warning will be given with a memo. For the third time, fine will be left with a memo. Finally the student will be issued TC and terminated.

RULES & REGULATIONS FOR USING MOBILE PHONES

- 1. Mobile phones, laptops must be used only for the purpose of education.
- 2. Use of phones, cameras, etc...is prohibited during the class hours inside the campus. If found in contravention, they will be confiscated.
- 3. Mobile phones are strictly prohibited inside the library and during examination.
- 4. The students should not use mobile phones while attending meetings, workshops, functions and other activities of the College.
- 5. Laptops must be used as a tool for education. If used for any other purposes like watching movies, surfing social sites, immediate action will be taken.
- Mobile phones must remain switched off inside the College premises. Mobile phones must not be charged inside the classrooms.
- 7. The following list gives examples of sort of materials or activities that will be regarded as unacceptable by the usage of laptops and mobile phones.
 - (a) Bullying /Harassment
 - (b) Personal insults, attacks/abuse
 - (c) Games, entertainment
- 8. If your mobile phone is lost or stolen, the College will not be responsible.

- 9. Under disciplinary actions, the Principal is empowered to fine, suspend or even expel a student from the College in the interest of the institution.
- 10. The College lays a great emphasis on decent behavior from every student.
- Any breach of this policy will be treated as a potential disciplinary issue and dealt with through our disciplinary procedure.

Dress Code

• All the girls should wear saree or churidar with lengthy tops below knee level without slit or Anarkali churidar or churidar with umbrella cut and dhupatta neatly pinned in 'V' shape. Colouring/bleaching the hair and Wearing leggins (Stretch pants), transparent or net dhupata is not permitted.

Care of the College Property

- Students are expected to take proper care of the College property and help in keeping premises neat and clean. Disfiguring the walls and doors or breaking the furniture is a breach of discipline and will be severely punished.
- 2. The cost of any so caused will be recovered from the students collectively, if responsibility for it cannot be fixed on any individual or individuals.
- 3. Students should not damage the college property. They should not scribble anything on the green board, table, furniture and walls. Action will be taken against the students who damage the property.
- 4. Students are advised to switch off the fans and lights when they leave the class rooms.

Classroom Manners

1. Students should not come late to class. (Late comers should get permission slip from the Principal/HOD)



- 2. Students should apply for leave / on duty through proper permission from tutor, chair person and HOD in prior.
- 3. They should not absent themselves without prior permission.
- 4. Students are not permitted to sit inside the class room closing the door in the absence of the staff.
- 5. Students should not shout, hoot or whistle during class hours and in College function. They should maintain strict discipline within the campus and students should occupy their allotted seats in college function.
- 6. Chewing bubble gum, chocolate and any other eatable item inside the class room should be avoided.

GIRLS HOSTEL RULES AND REGULATION

HOSTEL

Admission to Hostel

- 1. All applications for admission to the hostel shall be made to the Warden in the prescribed form.
- Deserving students are selected for admission into hostel, subject to the availability of rooms. They shall vacate room at the end of the semester and seek fresh admission to the next semester.
- 3. No reasons whatsoever need be given for rejection of any application.
- 4. Students shall follow all the rules given along with the application.

Fees

- 1. The selected student shall be admitted in the hostel only on payment of prescribed fees.
- 2. Room rent once paid will not be refunded under any circumstances.

Mess and Mess Rules

1. The Mess will be run on dividing system.

2. Food will be served in the mess only during the timing given below:

Morning Tea : $6.00 \, \text{a.m} \, \text{to} \, 7.00 \, \text{a.m}$

Breakfast : 7.45 a.m to 8.45 a.m.

Lunch : 1.00 p.m to 2.00 p.m

Evening coffee / tea : 4.30 p.m to 5.30 p.m

Supper : 8.00 pm to 9.00 pm

3. Food should not be taken to rooms. Students should eat only in the Dining Hall.

- 4. Only members of hostel committee are permitted to enter the kitchen and give instruction to cooks and servants; others are not permitted to do so, under any circumstance.
- 5. Mess bill for the previous month shall be paid before 15th of every month. Anyone who has not paid the dues on or before 15th of that month will be directed to vacate the Hostel.

Study Hours

- Hostel inmates are expected to devote their time from 6.45 p.m. to 8.00 p.m. and 9.00 pm to 10.00 p.m. to their private studies and as such strict silence should be maintained during the study time.
- At other times they shall conduct their activities but not to cause any inconvenience to their fellow students, who may be studying or otherwise engaged.

Attention to Parents/Students:

1. As per the rules and regulations of our Indian Government, ragging is banned among students. If anyone is found to be



- involved in any form of ragging, she will be dismissed from the college and legal action will be taken.
- 2. Girls should paste a recent passport size photograph with their parents and guardian (who should be above 35 years of age)
- 3. Apart from the permitted holidays, if the parents wish to call their wards to home, they can contact the hostel authorities only through their authorized mobile number.
- 4. Also, the student can be sent home only with either of the parents or the guardian whose photograph is pasted on the identity card.
- 5. Parents are not allowed to meet their wards during the week days.

VISITING TIME: SUNDAYS - Holidays

Morning 9:00 a.m. to Evening 5:00 p.m.

On working days - 4 pm. to 6 pm.

- 6. The college and Hostel authorities are not responsible for any untoward incident happening outside the college premises to any student.
- 7. Students can possess mobile phones but should strictly adhere to the rules and regulations of our college. They can contact their parents only on these mobile numbers.
- 8. Students can possess Laptop or Computer in the hostel only for academic purpose by obtaining prior permission. But peripheral devices like printers, speakers etc. are not permitted.
- 9. Students are not permitted to use electrical appliances (Iron Box, Electric Kettle etc.). In case of any violation, disciplinary action will be taken.
- 10. Students should take care of their valuables and ornaments. The college and the hostel management are not responsible for any lost items.

- 11. Students should lock their rooms whenever they go out. They are not permitted to stay in the hostel during the college working hours. Electrical lamps and fans should be switched off before the rooms are locked and not used by the students.
- 12. Students should remain in their allotted rooms only. They should not stay or sleep in other's room. Any violation of this rule will be dealt with disciplinary action by the college management.
- 13. The deputy warden / representatives nominated by the college management are empowered to check any student room and their belongings at any time, if there is a need. Possessions of belongings which are injurious to health are strictly prohibited. Violation of this rules will be seriously viewed and stringent action will be taken.
- 14. Students should not cause any damage to properties in hostel, mess halls and college premises under any circumstances. Any violation will lead to suspension from the hostel and college.
- Medical assistance is available in the hostel premises. Needed/further medical assistance can be given on Doctor's suggestion and the parents will be informed immediately.
- 16. The college and hostel managements are not responsible for any untoward incident happening to any student who violates the rules and regulations of the hostel.

"Ragging is any disorderly conduct, whether by words spoken or written, or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any student, indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the psyche of a fresher or a junior student".

- SUPREME COURT OF INDIA

- Eve teasing and ragging are strictly prohibited.
- All students should produce their Identity Cards when ever asked for.
- The Principal has the undisputed authority to penalize or dismiss or suspend any misbehaving student.
- Group clashes, violence, assaults and indecent behaviour towards teacher and non- teaching staff are considered serious offences for which punishments like suspension or expulsion is effected.
- Decision of the Principal is final with regard to interpreting offence and punishment.
- The Principal may alter or amend the above rules or add further rules from time to time for smooth functioning of the college. The Principal's interpretation of rules is final.

RULES TO BE FOLLOWED IN THE COLLEGE BUS

- 1. All the passengers/visitors must get the bus pass from the Office. Strict silence should be maintained in the bus.
- 2. The bus pass will be cancelled if the student misbehaves in the bus.
- 3. Principal through Bus Committee has every power to change the timing of the bus, if necessary.



4. Bus fees for the semester must be remitted at the beginning of every semester or before 15th of every month.

LIBRARY RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. Silence is to be observed in the library.
- 2. It is obligatory on all students of the college to be members of the library and reading room.
- 3. Students have the privilege of direct access to the shelves in the stack room and reading room. No one is allowed to bring any other textbook or article inside the library.
- 4. Users must scan their ID card in the gate register. Each member will be given two books at a time. The books and their ID cards are not transferable. Loss of the above should be intimated immediately to the librarian.
- 5. No one is allowed to pass on any book to another or to lend them to anyone in /out side of the college.
- 6. The system registers every book issued and returned.
- 7. Books borrowed must be returned on or before the due date. Only one renewal can be done for any borrowed books.
- 8. Reference materials (Reference books, Dissertations, Periodicals etc) are to be used inside the library.
- 9. A fine of Rs.2 for the late returned books & Rs.5 for the late of renewed books will be charged.
- 10. The textbooks will be issued to the economically poor students on payment of a nominal fee of RS.20 per semester. An application duly signed by the Head of the Department should be submitted to the librarian.
- 11. At the end of each semester both the staff and students are expected to return all the books to the library. In order to clear their due, the library staff will examine the books

- returned. If a book is damaged, lost or spoiled, all persons who borrowed one book, during the semester should replace it with a new copy.
- 12. Its only after obtaining a clearance certificate from the library, the hall ticket and transfer certificate will be issued.
- 13. Books should be handled with love and care. Marking on books is most objectionable. Students are strictly forbidden to tear or scribble on page of magazines and books. Any students found doing this will be punished severely.
- 14. The postgraduate departments such as English, Commerce, Nutrition & Dietetics and Computer Science have their department libraries which are attached to main library.
- 15. Users are required to switch off the lights and fans while leaving the reading hall.
- 16. The library will be closed on Sunday and on all Government Holidays.
- 17. Students and staff who leave the college for any reason in the middle of the first term should return the books before they leave the college.
