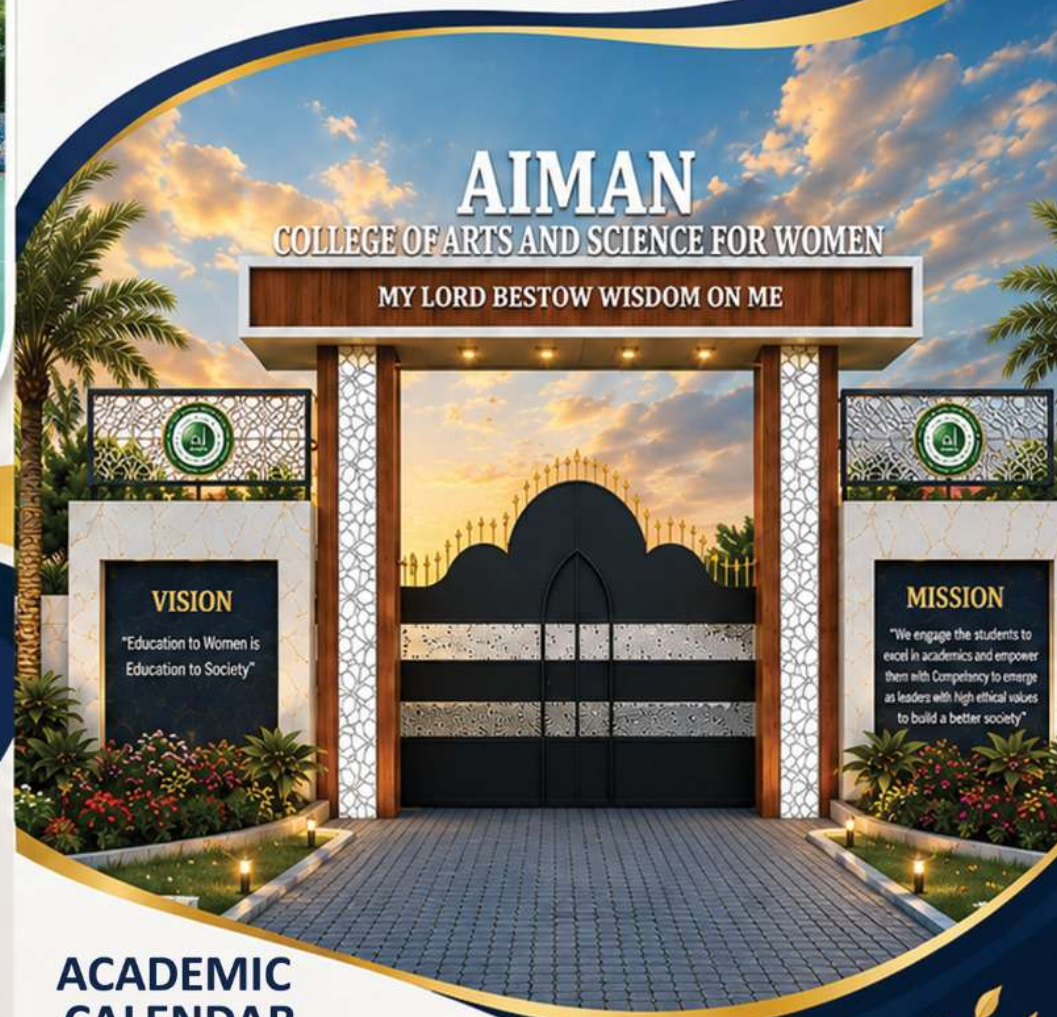

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

AIMAN COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCE FOR WOMEN, established by the AIMAN EDUCATION AND WELFARE SOCIETY, is an educational institution dedicated to providing higher education exclusively to girl children, especially to the socially backward section. The college was established in 2000 in Tiruchirappalli, Tamil Nadu, with 50 students enrolled in 3 undergraduate courses.

Over the years, the commitment of the institution to academic excellence has led it to make remarkable achievements in its path of growth. The annals of AIMAN College now proudly proclaim the accreditation of **“A” Grade** in the first cycle by NAAC, with a CGPA of 3.01 out of 4 in 2024.

The College is located at K.Sathanur, K.K Nagar, Tiruchirappalli, 3 km from the Panjapur Bus Stand and 5 km from the Tiruchirappalli Railway Junction, Central Bus Stand and Airport. The day scholars are commuted by 13 college buses from the city and places up to 60 km away from the college. A free shuttle bus service from the Central Bus Stand to the College is also available.

The College has developed into a dynamic institution with its impressive expansion in academic horizons and infrastructural dimensions, aligning with the state-of-the-art learning environment. The College offers 11 Undergraduate Courses, such as B.A. English, BBA, B.Com, B.Com. Computer Applications, B.C.A., B.Sc. Computer Science, B.Sc. Mathematics, B.Sc. Physics, B.Sc. Nutrition and Dietetics, B.Sc. Apparel and Fashion Technology, and B.Sc. Psychology. Postgraduate courses include M.A. English, M.Com., M.Sc. Computer Science, M.Sc. Food Service Management and Dietetics, M.Com. Computer Applications and M.Sc. Psychology.

The College also offers the “**Certificate in Library and Information Science (CLIS)**”, a six-month diploma course designed to equip students with essential library management and information handling skills and knowledge for careers in library and information centers. At present, the college serves 1125 students, supported by 69 teaching and 24 non-teaching staff members.

AIMAN campus embodies the comforting, ethical, and divine aura that attracts students from various parts of the state to unlock their true learner in them. To ensure the safety and well-being of residential students, the campus offers a secure and comfortable hostel facility.

The serene campus of AIMA College consists of an administrative block, three two-storied academic blocks, a digital Library, one resplendent air-conditioned Auditorium with an LED screen, a modernized air-conditioned Conference Hall with an LCD projector and acoustics systems, advanced Computer Labs, a modern Textile Testing Lab and Sewing Studio, a sophisticated Communication Lab, well-equipped Physics and Chemistry Laboratories, an intriguing Psychology Lab, and a fully furnished Nutrition and Dietetics Lab. The on-campus cafeteria serves healthy and delicious food at affordable prices to all visitors and meticulously upholds cleanliness and hygiene, ensuring the wellness of the consumers.

The College has facilities such as an Indoor Stadium, a Basketball Court, a Kabaddi court, a Volleyball Court, a Kho Kho Court, an open gym, and an open stage, along with on-campus yoga training sessions, and motivates students to engage in various extracurricular activities to promote sports and skill development.

The College portrays its eco-consciousness by being involved in creating a sustainable green environment through nurturing a herbal garden. The entire campus is monitored under CCTV surveillance to ensure a safe and secure learning environment for students.

The hostel offers both air-conditioned and non-air-conditioned rooms, along with a spacious, clean, and well-maintained kitchen and dining hall. An exclusive NRI block with air-conditioned rooms is also available.

The College ensures prompt attention to the physical and mental health needs of students and staff through counselling services, medical assistance, and first aid whenever required. To provide immediate healthcare support, the College has Health Centres on both the college campus and the hostel premises, ensuring timely medical assistance and care for students.

Discipline and character-building are given prime importance in the college. Moral Education classes are held regularly on Fridays, except on exam days. A modest Masjid adds to the spiritual component of the campus.

Since its inception, the college has consistently maintained excellent academic records in University Examinations by producing over 275 University Rank Holders. Most of the alumnae are well-placed and well-settled in our country and abroad. A Special feature of the college is the **MUBALLIGA** Course, a three-year Diploma Course offered under the auspices of the United Welfare Organization (UNWO / UNIS), Chennai.

As part of its Skill Development initiative, the College offers students professional training in Tailoring, Aari Designing, Tally, Spoken English and Hindi, Competitive Exam coaching, Driving class and Office Automation course delivered by experts in the fields, in collaboration with the Institute of Entrepreneurship and Career Development (IECD), Bharathidasan University, Trichy. Furthermore, Value-Added courses are offered to students by various departments to enrich their skills and enhance their employability.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- All admissions are carried out in accordance with the guidelines prescribed by the University and relevant authorities.
- The college follows the Day Order System. Days are denoted by I, II, III, IV, V & VI, and the timetable will be followed accordingly in a continuous manner.
- If the college is closed on any working day due to unforeseen circumstances, the corresponding day order will be followed on a Saturday to make up for the lost working day.
- If a student discontinues from college during a semester, she cannot claim a refund of any portion of the fees.
- If a student has duly paid all fees and cleared dues to the laboratories and library, she will obtain a Transfer Certificate and Conduct Certificate by submitting an application to the Principal.
- If a student leaves the college at the end of an academic year, she will receive the attendance certificate required by the University if she applies for it.
- 100% attendance and the best library user will be awarded on the Annual Day.
- Attendance is compulsory for all functions and departmental activities.
- All students should participate in Part V activities such as NSS, LEO, EXNORA, YRC, RRC and so on.
- The Self Card and the Special Permission Card for day scholars are valid only for a semester. Renewal should be done once at the beginning of every semester. Meanwhile, the bus card will be renewed once a year.
- The **Self Card for day scholars** who leave the campus at **3.00 p.m.** should be obtained from the office with the approval of the respective Class Coordinator, the HoD, and the Principal.
- The **Special Permission Card** is issued once every semester to day scholars who are required to leave the college regularly at

1.00 p.m. to attend a part-time job or a part-time course. The card will be issued only upon submission of valid documentary proof supporting the purpose of leaving the campus at **1:00 p.m.** The required proof must be submitted by the student to the college office.

PAYMENT OF FEES

- The institution follows an annual fee payment system for college, transport, hostel, and mess services.
- Students must pay the fees within 30 days of the reopening of the College.
- Students are permitted to pay the college fee, the hostel fee, the bus fee and the mess fee biannually on a semester-by-semester basis. Payment of any fees in multiple installments is not allowed.
- The fees for each semester and the university examinations should be paid on or before the last date notified on the notice board. Students who do not pay the semester fees on or before the last date will incur a late fee penalty.
- If any student continues to delay the fee payment even after being charged the penalty, she will be removed from the rolls without any prior intimation. The Principal may consider re-admission of such students at her discretion.
- All fee payments, once made, are non-refundable under any circumstances.

GENERAL RULES ON BEHAVIOUR

- Students must come to the college dressed modestly.
- Gathering in groups at the entrance, exit, pathways, staircases, gardens, or the gateway is strictly forbidden.
- All students should wear their Identity Cards on campus at all times.

- Upon entering the classroom, students must maintain complete silence, regardless of whether the teacher is present or not.
- Students are not permitted to leave the classroom or laboratory without the teacher's permission.
- Students are responsible for reading the notices posted on the college notice board.
- Failure to comply with instructions in the notices due to ignorance will not be accepted as a valid excuse.
- No student shall display or distribute any notice without the Principal's approval.
- Students must not take disciplinary matters into their own hands with the college staff. All complaints must be reported to the Heads of Departments (HoDs) and the Principal .
- Students are not allowed to enter the classrooms of other classes under any circumstances or pretexts.
- Outsiders should not visit any students without the permission of the HoD or the Principal.
- Students are expected to maintain the college's reputation through proper conduct; any misconduct will result in strict disciplinary action.
- In the event of any misconduct, the student will initially be counselled or warned. If the misconduct is repeated or if the offence is of a serious nature, the student's parents/guardians will be informed, and appropriate disciplinary action, including suspension, dismissal, or issuance of a Transfer Certificate, may be taken.
- The Principal has the undisputed authority to penalise, dismiss, or suspend any student for misconduct.
- Acts such as group clashes, violence, physical assault, intimidation, ragging, or any form of disrespectful or unacceptable behaviour towards teaching or non-teaching staff are treated as serious offences and may result in suspension, expulsion, or any other disciplinary action deemed appropriate by the College authorities.

- The decision of the Principal regarding the interpretation of offences and punishments is final.
- The Principal reserves the right to modify, amend, or add rules as needed to ensure the smooth functioning of the college. The Principal's interpretation of these rules is final.

RULES & REGULATIONS FOR USING MOBILE PHONES

To ensure a disciplined and focused learning environment, the following guidelines must be strictly followed by all students:

✓ Permitted Use

- Mobile phones can be used only for academic purposes.
- Use of mobile phones for watching movies, playing games, or browsing social media is strictly prohibited. Violating it will lead to disciplinary action.

✓ General Restrictions

- Mobile phones must remain switched off at all times within the College premises.
- Charging phones inside classrooms is not allowed.
- Use of mobile phones, cameras, or similar devices is prohibited during class hours. Any such device found in use will be confiscated immediately.
- Phones are not permitted in the library, during examinations, or while attending meetings, workshops, functions, and other College events.

✓ Laptop Use

- Laptops are to be used as educational tools only with the approval of the concerned class coordinator, HoD and the Principal.
- Any misuse, such as accessing entertainment or non-educational content, will lead to immediate disciplinary action.

✓ Unacceptable Activities

- The use of mobile phones or laptops for any of the following purposes is strictly prohibited:
 - ◆ Bullying, harassment, or intimidation.
 - ◆ Personal insults, abusive language, or offensive communication.
 - ◆ Gaming, entertainment, or other non-academic activities during college hours.
 - ◆ Recording, sharing, or posting the photographs, videos, or personal content of any staff members or individuals without their explicit consent.

✓ Liability Disclaimer

- The College is not responsible for lost or stolen mobile phones or other personal electronic devices.

✓ Disciplinary Measures

- Any violation of the above-mentioned rules will be treated as a serious disciplinary matter.
- The Principal has full authority to fine, suspend, or even expel students found in breach of these rules.
- All students must maintain respectful and responsible conduct at all times.

DRESS CODE

- Students must dress modestly. They can wear a saree or a churidar with long tops that extend below the knee without slits.
- Anarkali churidars and churidars with an umbrella cut, paired with a neatly pinned dupatta, are also acceptable.
- Students are not permitted to keep their hair unplaited, colour or bleach their hair, wear leggings (stretch pants), or wear transparent or net dupattas.

CARE OF THE COLLEGE PROPERTY

- Students are responsible for the College property and must keep the premises clean.
- The cost of any damage will be collectively recovered from students if responsibility cannot be assigned to any individual.
- Students should switch off the fans and lights when they leave the classroom.

Classroom Manners

- Students must not arrive late to class.
- Students must apply for leave or on-duty permission in advance through the proper channel, obtaining approval from the Class Coordinator and the Head of the concerned Department (HoD).
- Students should not be absent without prior permission.
- Students are not allowed to be inside the classroom by keeping the classroom door closed when a staff member is not in the class.
- Students should not shout, hoot or whistle during class hours and at College functions. They should maintain strict discipline on campus, and students should occupy their allotted seats in college functions.
- Chewing bubble gum, chocolates, or any other snack items inside the classroom is strictly prohibited.

GUIDELINES FOR HOSTELLERS & PARENTS

1. According to the Government rules and regulations, ragging is strictly prohibited among students. Disciplinary or legal actions will be taken against violators.
2. Hostellers should affix recent passport-size photographs of their parents and guardian on the visitor's card.
3. Only those whose photographs are affixed on the card will be permitted to take their wards home from the hostel.
4. Parents are not allowed to meet their wards during the weekdays.

5. The college and the hostel authorities are not liable for any untoward incidents occurring outside the college premises to any student.
6. Students can possess mobile phones, but should strictly adhere to the rules and regulations of our college.
7. Students can possess a laptop in the hostel only for academic use, subject to prior permission. They are fully responsible for the maintenance and safety of their devices. However, peripheral devices like printers, speakers, and others are prohibited.
8. Students are prohibited from using electrical appliances such as iron boxes and electric kettles. Any violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.
9. Students should take care of their valuables and ornaments. The college and the hostel management are not responsible for any lost items.
10. Students should lock their rooms whenever they go out. They are not allowed to remain in the hostel during college working hours. Electric lamps and fans should be switched off before locking the rooms and whenever they are not in use.
11. Students should stay only in their allotted rooms. They should not stay or sleep in others' rooms. Any violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action by the college management.

12. The Deputy Warden or representatives appointed by the college management have the authority to inspect any student's room and belongings at any time if necessary.
13. Possession of anything harmful to health is strictly forbidden. Failure to cooperate during inspections or possession of harmful items will be treated very seriously and may lead to strict disciplinary action.
14. Students should not cause any damage to properties in the hostel, mess halls and college premises under any circumstances. Any violation will lead to suspension from the hostel and college.

LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Silence is to be observed in the library.
- All students of the college must be members of the library and the reading room.
- Students have the privilege of direct access to the shelves in the stack room and the reading room. No one is allowed to bring any other textbook or article inside the library.
- Users must scan their ID card at the gate register. Each UG and PG member is allowed to borrow a maximum of three and four books, respectively, at a time. Students should not use another student's ID card to borrow books from the library.
- Loss of borrowed books should be reported immediately to the librarian.
- No one is permitted to give or lend any book to another person, either within or outside the college.
- Every book issued or returned should be properly registered in the library.
- Books borrowed must be returned on or before the due date. Only two renewals can be done for any borrowed books.
- Reference materials (Dictionary, Encyclopaedia, Almanas, Yearbook, Rare books, Question Bank, Dissertations, etc) are to be used inside the library.
- If a book is returned after the due date, a fine of Rs. 2 per day will be charged for each late return.
- The textbooks will be issued to economically disadvantaged students for a nominal fee of Rs. 20 per semester, with the application approved by the Head of the Department.
- At the end of each semester, both staff and students must return all the books to the library. In order to clear their dues, the library staff will examine the books returned.

- If a book is damaged, lost or spoiled, the user who borrowed the book is responsible for replacing it with a new copy.
- It is only after obtaining a clearance certificate from the library, the hall ticket and transfer certificate will be issued.
- Books should be handled with love and care. Tearing pages, marking, or scribbling on magazines or library books is strictly prohibited. Any students found doing such activities will be punished.
- The postgraduate departments, such as English, Commerce, Computer Science and Food Service Management and Dietetics, have their department libraries which are attached to the main library.
- Users are required to switch off the lights and fans while leaving the reading hall.
- The library will be closed on Sundays and Government Holidays.
- Students and staff who leave the college for any reason in the middle of the first term should return the books before they leave the college.

- The free bus facility will not be available during examination periods. Students are expected to make their own transportation arrangements during these times.
- Students must board and alight the free bus only at the locations officially allocated to them. Travelling from or to any other stop is strictly prohibited.
- Students must carry their valid bus pass at all times while using the service. Students found without a bus pass will forfeit their eligibility to continue availing the free bus facility.
- The college management reserves the right to withdraw or cancel the free bus service for any student or group of students at its discretion without prior notice.

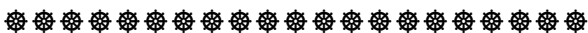

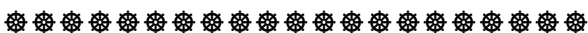
